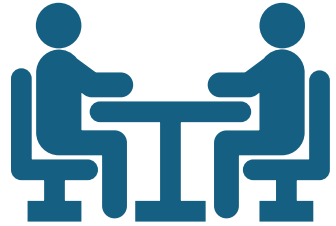

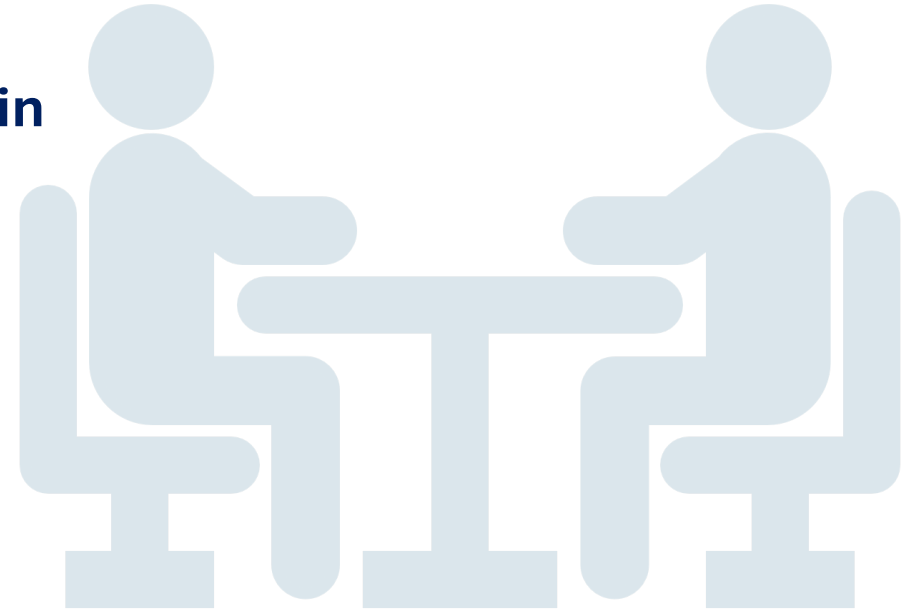

Scenario 1

HINT: 'Rule of Two'

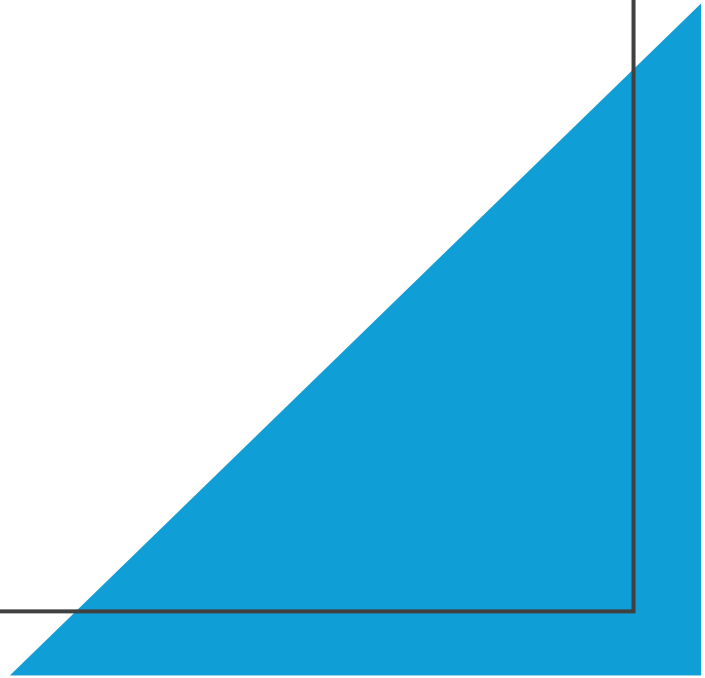


Scenario 2
